YELLOW PERCH	No Size Limit	50	No Closed Season
BLACK CRAPPIE	9 inches	25	No Closed Season
SUNFISH (bluegill, pumpkinseed, & redbreast sunfish)	No Size Limit	50	No Closed Season
BULLHEAD, CARP, SUCKERS, GOLDFISH, CREEK CHUB, FALLFISH	No Size Limit	No Limit	No Closed Season
AMERICAN EEL	6 inches	50	No Closed Season
BLACK BASS (largemouth & smallmouth)	15 inches (for Wilkins Pond – 20 inches)	3**	3 rd Sat. in June to 30 November@

** Daily bag limit for bass in Cranberry & Weyants Pond is one 15-inch minimum size bass/day. In Wilkins Pond, an angler is only allowed to keep one bass/year, and it must be at least 20 inches long. @ - Catch-and-Release Bass Fishing can occur from 1 December through the Friday before the Opening Day with the following exceptions: Stilwell Lake – NO Catch-&-Release Bass Fishing Allowed during the closed season; Bull Pond, Round Pond, and Lusk Reservoir – Catch-&-Release Bass Fishing Only during the period from 1 April through the Friday before the Opening Day.

*****NOTE: IF A SEASON IS NOT OPEN, YOU CANNOT ACTIVELY FISH FOR THAT SPECIES*****

Mineral Springs Brook & Trout Brook: Catch-and-Release Fishing ONLY for trout.

**Round Pond, Bull Pond, Highland Brook, Mineral Springs Brook, Trout Brook & Queensboro Brook:
OPEN FOR FISHING BETWEEN 1 APRIL & 15 OCTOBER ONLY.**

Lusk Reservoir: OPEN FOR FISHING BETWEEN 1 APRIL & 30 NOVEMBER ONLY.

TO FISH IN ANY WATERS AT WEST POINT, EVERY ANGLER 16 YEARS OLD AND OLDER MUST POSSESS BOTH A NEW YORK STATE FISHING LICENSE AND A WEST POINT FISHING PERMIT.

BAITFISH MAY NOT BE RELEASED ALIVE IN ANY WEST POINT WATERS.

IAW USMA Regulation 215-5, all Anglers are required to report all fish **kept** to the West Point Natural Resources Branch. Anglers can either: use the forms found in the angler report boxes; participate in the West Point angler diary program; telephone in your catch (938-3857), or e-mail your report. Required information includes - locations where the fish were caught, the date when the fish were caught & the number of each species kept.
