Free Online Tutoring

CYSS now offers free online tutoring services to Army affiliated students through www.tutor.com. Students (Military and children of Army civilian employees) should go to www.myarmyonesource.com to submit a one time registration to obtain their CYSS passcode. Students can use it from home or from the CYS Services Technology Labs. They enter their grade level and the subject in which they need assistance. Educational support is available for Kindergarten - 12th grade in math, science, English, and social studies. Once grade and subject are submitted, the student is connected to the first available subject expert tutor in an online classroom. Students and tutors work together in an online classroom using controlled chat and an interactive white board. Students can send computer files, such as essays, to the tutor for review and assistance. Tutors are certified teachers, college professors, or graduate school students from across the country.
